EMBLEM

The University emblem, consisting of two concentric circles, with the inner circle divided into two halves, one half showing the rising sun, the other depicting the waters and a hundred-petalled lotus emanating from them, symbolises the unity of knowledge and action, whole and part, and time eternity. The Rigvedic hymn in the space between the upper circumferences of the two circles is a prayer to all powers auspicious, and an invocation of all intentions noble, all actions good, and all wisdom serene.

The circle, the sun, the waters, and the lotus in the emblem are all archetypes of wholeness. The mandala is a familiar motive of Indian art and iconography. The Vedic supernal sun and the surface of the mythic lotus are circular in shape (mandalakara).

The supernal sun is verily the Person (Purusha), the Divine Being, the all-whole, divided into four parts, one representing the three worlds of earth, sky, and space (bhutani), and the remaining three, that is the major part representing Heaven and Immortality (amritam divi).

It is this all-whole (akhanda mandalakaram) that the part (ams'a), that is man, perennially craves to unite with, through right knowledge and right action (Karatub). The Vedic hymn then expresses nothing more nor less than the universal human yearning for right knowledge, right intentions, and right action (bhadrah kratavo) to come to him from all cosmic and supra cosmic corners. And it is this ideal of right intention that they seek to inculcate among their alumni.

The lotus is again the seat and seed-bed, in Indian mythology, of the goddess of knowledge (Saraswati). The waters are the ultimate source from which all manifestations proceed and are appropriately depicted in myth and art as the residue (shesha), the irreducible unknown and unshown to which everything known and shown can be reduced. The residue (shesha) is analogically the non-residual (ashesha), the endless whole (ananta).

The traditional art motifs reproduced in the emblem only intend to express and reinforce the symbolism of the Vedic hymn, which our founding fathers had rightly selected as our motto.

2. General Rules for Admission to Various Post Graduation Programmes:

1. Application fee is non-refundable.
2. Candidates need to apply separately for each Post Graduate programme.
3. Candidates are required to submit an application fee separately for each programme for which they are applying.
4. In various programmes, the number of seats for admission in University Campus and affiliated Government/ Aided/ Self-Financed Colleges through the Joint Entrance Test being conducted by the University is predetermined. Admissions to Minority Colleges (if any) will be in accordance with Government Order No-265I/ Sattar-2-2003- 1161921/2002 Dated 02 July 2003.
5. Candidates should thoroughly go through the PG Brochure/relevant Brochure before filling out the application form.
6. Candidates applying for M.Ed./ B.P.Ed. Programmes should thoroughly go through the concerned brochure before filling out the Application form.
7. Seventeen (17) years of age is the minimum age for admission in postgraduate programmes.
8. All candidates aspiring for admission in any programme shall be charged Rs 200.00 as a counselling fee. The rate of counselling fee shall remain unchanged in case of the programmes where it had already been charged in earlier years/ sessions.
9. All admissions shall be done on a merit basis against the seats available in different Post-Graduation Programmes.
10. Entrance test shall not be conducted in those post-graduation programmes where the number of applicants is less than the number of seats available.
11. The merit lists declared by the university shall be final and binding.
12. If any document/declaration submitted by the candidate is found to be false/ forged at any stage of admission, his/ her admission shall be cancelled, and he/she may be liable for prosecution under law.
13. The University shall not be liable for any kind of error in filling out the application forms by the candidates. Any change in the application form shall not be acceptable later on.
14. Candidates themselves must download their admit card, counselling letter/ allotment letter, etc., from the university website.
15. Application submitted in one programme shall not be transferred to another programme.

16. The University reserves the right to make circumstantial changes in the rules of the admission process to make it more effective and convenient.
17. More than one post-graduate programme can be combined for the entrance test.
18. The result of the Entrance Test declared by the University shall be final. There is no provision for re-valuation/scrutiny.

3. Reservation will be subject to the latest provisions of the Government (Only for University Campus and affiliated Government/Aided Colleges).

NOTE:

To avail the benefit of reservation, candidates have to produce the latest certificate issued by the competent authority of their district, i.e., District Magistrate / Additional District Magistrate / Tehsildar, at the time of admission; otherwise, claims to reservation may be rejected. Candidates belonging to Other Backward Classes are required to produce their latest caste certificate issued by the competent authority, which clearly mentions that they do not fall under the Creamy Layer as per the State Government's latest provision. Reservation to the Economically Weaker Section (EWS) will be provided as per the government order no. Personnel Section -2 Number- 3/2019/4/12002/P-2/1914 dated 14 March, 2019.

It is to be informed that the Government's latest reservation-related mandates will be followed. Horizontal reservation shall be subject to producing the relevant certificates on prescribed format only.

4. Weightage for Entrance Test

(A)

1. 02% for Women candidates.
2. 02% for students having a B/C Certificate in NCC.
3. 02% for students of Scout/Guide/ Rover/Rangers.
4. 02% for the candidates who served 240 hours and took part in at least one special camp under NSS. This weightage is applicable only when the Vice Chancellor has signed the certificate.

Note

- i. Not more than two of the above-mentioned weightages shall be added together.
- ii. No candidate shall be entitled to more than 04% weightage based on any four of the above.

(B)

1. 10% weightage is admissible to unmarried son/daughter and wife/husband of retired/deceased regular teaching and non-teaching staff of the University Campus.
2. 10% weightage is admissible to an unmarried son/daughter and wife/husband of a serving/retired/deceased regular teaching and non-teaching staff of the affiliated Government / Aided Colleges.

Note:

- i. The benefit of this weightage will be given only for admission in the University campus and affiliated Government / Aided Colleges. The maximum limit for weightage by combining (A) and (B) will be 10%.

(C)

1. For the dependents (husband/wife/son/daughter) of regular teaching and non-teaching serving staff of the university, the maximum reservation is 10% of the total number of seats for admission in postgraduate programmes. Applicants in this category will have to produce the Dependent Certificate issued by the Registrar to the Director, Admission Cell, within the stipulated date. These admissions will be as per the reservation rules, availability of seats in the programme, and marks scored in the Joint Entrance Test. No dependent will be admitted to the University without appearing in the Entrance Test. This facility is permissible only for the University Campus.
2. There shall be no provision of seats for dependents (husband/wife/son/daughter) of regular teaching and non-teaching serving staff of the University campus and affiliated Government/Aided Colleges in M.Ed. Programmes.

(D)

1. In the Post Graduate programmes of the University campus, seats are earmarked for the candidates who have secured positions /participation in the State / National / International level sports competitions. Admission under this will be given as per the criteria set through the competent committee nominated by the Vice Chancellor. Candidates have to necessarily indicate it at the place specified in the application form. If the admission of a candidate with such an option is not done on a merit basis, then

the person will be issued information for admission in the sports quota through the proper channel. Applicants shall have to appear with a State / National / International level Sports Certificate. Under the sports quota, the merit will also be formed and followed for admission as per the faculty-wise allocated seats. This facility is available for the University Campus only.

(E)

1. The following number of seats are allocated in Post Graduate programmes (only in non-self-financed courses) under Sports Quota in various faculties to the candidates who have secured a place/participation in Inter-University sports tournaments with place/participation at the State, national, and international level sports (if any).

5. Eligibility for admission in different postgraduate programmes:

Only those students who have passed the graduation or its equivalent examination will be eligible for admission to PG programmes. Students appearing for graduation or its equivalent examination in the year 2026 can also appear in the Post Graduate Entrance Tests; however, at the time of admission, they have to produce the passing certificate/mark sheet of the qualifying examination.

CGPA corresponding to the pass percentage required for admission in different Post Graduation programmes shall also be acceptable for admission.

Eligibility rules for LL.B., LL.M, B.P.Ed., and M.Ed. programmes are different. So, interested candidates must thoroughly see the PG Brochure/programme-specific brochures.

Qualified candidates can claim admission in any one of the offered post-graduate programmes.

6-A. Other rules for admission in LL.B. First Semester:

1. L.L.B. (Three Years) is a full-time regular programme. Students cannot take admission in any other course (Degree/Diploma/Research, etc.) of this or any other University/Institution. Such candidates who are government employees or students of any other course will not be considered eligible for this programme.
2. Admission in LL.B. will be granted based on the rank in the merit list together with achievement of minimum marks in LL.B. Entrance Examination, which is 35% for General applicants & EWS, 25% for OBC, 20% for SC, and 15% for ST category applicants.

6-B. Other rules for admission in LL.M. First Semester:

1. The students who have appeared in the LL.B. last semester examination can also take part in the LL.M. Entrance Examination on condition that they will have to produce a certificate of their minimum educational qualification at the time of admission; otherwise, they shall not be entitled to admission under any condition.
2. A gap of unlimited years after passing the qualifying examination is allowed to appear in the LL.M. Entrance Examination.
3. General rules of the University shall be applicable for deciding reservation, weightage, and minimum pass percentage (if any) in admission.
4. The medium of teaching and learning is Hindi; however, basic knowledge of English is essential for the purpose.
5. All the applicants who have applied for improvement/ back paper/ back semester, etc., and have been found eligible for the LL.M. Entrance Examination will have to produce their improved/ passed marksheet to the admission committee. If the result of these examinations has not been declared by the time, such applicants shall not be able to get admission.
6. The applicants who have passed their qualifying examination before 2026 will have to produce an affidavit for the declaration of the gap at the time of admission. The admission committee will permit such applicants for admission only when its members are fully satisfied with the reason cited in the affidavit.
7. Admission in LL.M. will be granted based on the rank in the merit list together with achievement of minimum marks in LL.M. Entrance Examination, which is 35% for General applicants & EWS, 25% for OBC, 20% for SC, and 15% for ST category applicants.
8. At the time of admission, every applicant will have to submit a Character Certificate issued by the institution last attended. This rule will also be applicable for the students of DDU Gorakhpur, Gorakhpur.
9. If any candidate has passed graduation through correspondence from any University, he/she will be allowed for admission only when such an applicant produces a certificate

issued by the Registrar of that University, to the effect that the UG correspondence degree of that University is equivalent to the regular UG degree of this university.

10. If any applicant fails to present himself/ herself with all his/ her original documents before the admission committee at the appointed time on the prescribed date, his/ her admission will stand cancelled.
11. The University reserves the right to deny admission to any applicant without citing the reason or to make desired circumstantial changes in the rules of admission.

7. Syllabus of Entrance Test for various Post Graduate Programmes Structure shall be uploaded on the university website/ admission portal soon.

8. Admission Procedure:

1. Entrance test dates for various programmes shall soon be available on the university's official website.
2. Admission to the Postgraduate programmes available in the University campus and colleges shall be done through online counselling.
3. Applicants can fill in their choice of colleges in order of preference within the stipulated time after the declaration of result of the entrance test.
4. Candidates found eligible shall be given provisional admission based on their choice of programme, entrance test score, and permissible weightage. Admission shall be given strictly according to the order of merit and the availability of seats.
5. The list of students with allotment to the University /Colleges will be made available on the university website in accordance with the respective programmes.
6. At the time of admission, the candidate has to present all the original certificates along with their self-attested photo copies (Aadhaar card, mark sheets, Caste Certificate, Weightage certificate, Disability/Ex-serviceman/dependent of freedom fighter) Kashmir displaced Kashmiri Pandits residing in Kashmir valley/Ward of Kashmiri Hindu family/Kargil martyrs, Divyangta certificate, Transfer Certificate, Character Certificate provided by the Principal of the institution last attended, etc.) to the Admission Committee. Candidates who have passed/obtained a qualifying degree from other universities will also have to bring a Migration certificate.
7. It will be mandatory for the candidates to get their names registered in the department after submission of the required fee in the concerned faculty office/college; otherwise, their admission is liable to be cancelled.
8. Original certificates regarding details of any category, sub-category, or weightage filled in by the candidates in the application form shall have to be produced at the time of admission. If the candidate is unable to produce the original certificates, they shall be deprived of the benefit, and the merit list is liable to be revised.
9. The candidate will have to declare to the effect that there is no criminal suit against her/him and in the future, if any FIR is registered, his/ her admission shall be liable to be cancelled.

10. The candidate must produce the print copy of their application form and admit card at the time of admission, and so they are advised to keep them safe.
11. All the forms/records related to the entrance test will be preserved only for six months after the completion of the entrance test.
12. The candidate shall be considered a regular student of the university/college from the date of payment of his/her admission fees after the counselling fee and registration at the concerned office.
13. Admission-related rules are as per the University Act, Statutes, and Ordinances. The admission committee may cancel the admission of any candidate without assigning any reason.
14. In case of any discrepancy in relation to admission, the decision of the admission committee shall prevail.
15. Once admitted and having appeared/failed in the examination of a particular class in the university/ college, a student shall not be readmitted in the same class but can appear as an Ex-student in the Examination.
16. The University reserves the right to amend the rules regarding admission procedure, number of seats, and fee structure.

9. Important and relevant instructions for Entrance Test:

1. The OMR answer sheet will be given along with the question booklet, on which the answer will have to be marked. Only the answer sheet (OMR) will be evaluated.
2. Each question will have four alternative answers, out of which candidates have to choose the correct answer by shading the circle of the choice with a black/blue ball pen against that question number.

Eligibility: Students admitted to the post-graduate first year in the aforementioned subjects and who obtain the highest marks in his / her under graduation in that subject.

On admission to the second year of post-graduation in the aforementioned subjects and obtaining 55 percent or more marks (this scholarship is awarded to the same student in the second year as was awarded in the first year).

2. Pt. Harihar Prasad Dube Foundation Trust Scholarship/ Fellowships

Pt. Harihar Prasad Dubev Foundation Trust Betiyahata, Gorakhpur, headquartered at 1064 Sobha Jasmine Outer Ring Road, Bellandur, Bangalore, Karnataka-5600103, is a registered society. This society signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the University. In the memory of Harihar Prasad Dube, a renowned lawyer and freedom fighter, and also the family members of Sri Dube ji, several scholarships have been established by the trust in different disciplines. These are as follows:

I. Shrimati Shanti Tiwari Memorial Scholarship

Eligibility: Students admitted to the postgraduate first year in Chemistry who secure the highest marks in his/her graduation in the subject.

Students admitted to the post-graduation second year in Chemistry who secure the highest marks in the first year of the same program.

II. Pt. Harihar Prasad Dube Memorial Scholarship

Scholarships to students of the following Subjects

1. Physics
2. Mathematics
3. Zoology

Eligibility: Students admitted to the first year in these subjects who secure the highest marks in their undergraduate studies in the same subject.

Student admitted to the second year in these subjects who achieves the highest marks in his/her first year of the program.

III. Smt. Pushpa Dube Memorial Scholarship

Eligibility: Students admitted to the postgraduate first year in Biotechnology, and who secure the highest marks.

Students admitted to the second year in Biotechnology who achieve the highest marks in his/her first-year postgraduate program.

IV. Prof. Prabha Shankar Pandey Memorial Scholarship

Eligibility: Students admitted to the first year in the Sociology postgraduate program, and who secure the highest marks in their undergraduate studies in the same subject.

A student admitted to the second year in Sociology who achieves the highest marks in his/her first-year postgraduation program.

V. Pt. Harihar Prasad Dube Innovation Award

Eligibility: The award shall be open to all students of the DDUGU campus. The criteria for selection will include, but are not limited to:

- Originality and novelty of the innovation.
- Practical application and potential impact of the innovation.
- Demonstration of creativity, problem-solving skills, and technical proficiency

3. Sri RamNiwas Memorial Scholarship

Eligibility: Any students of the DDUGU campus who got the highest marks in the post-graduation (first year) program of Mathematics.

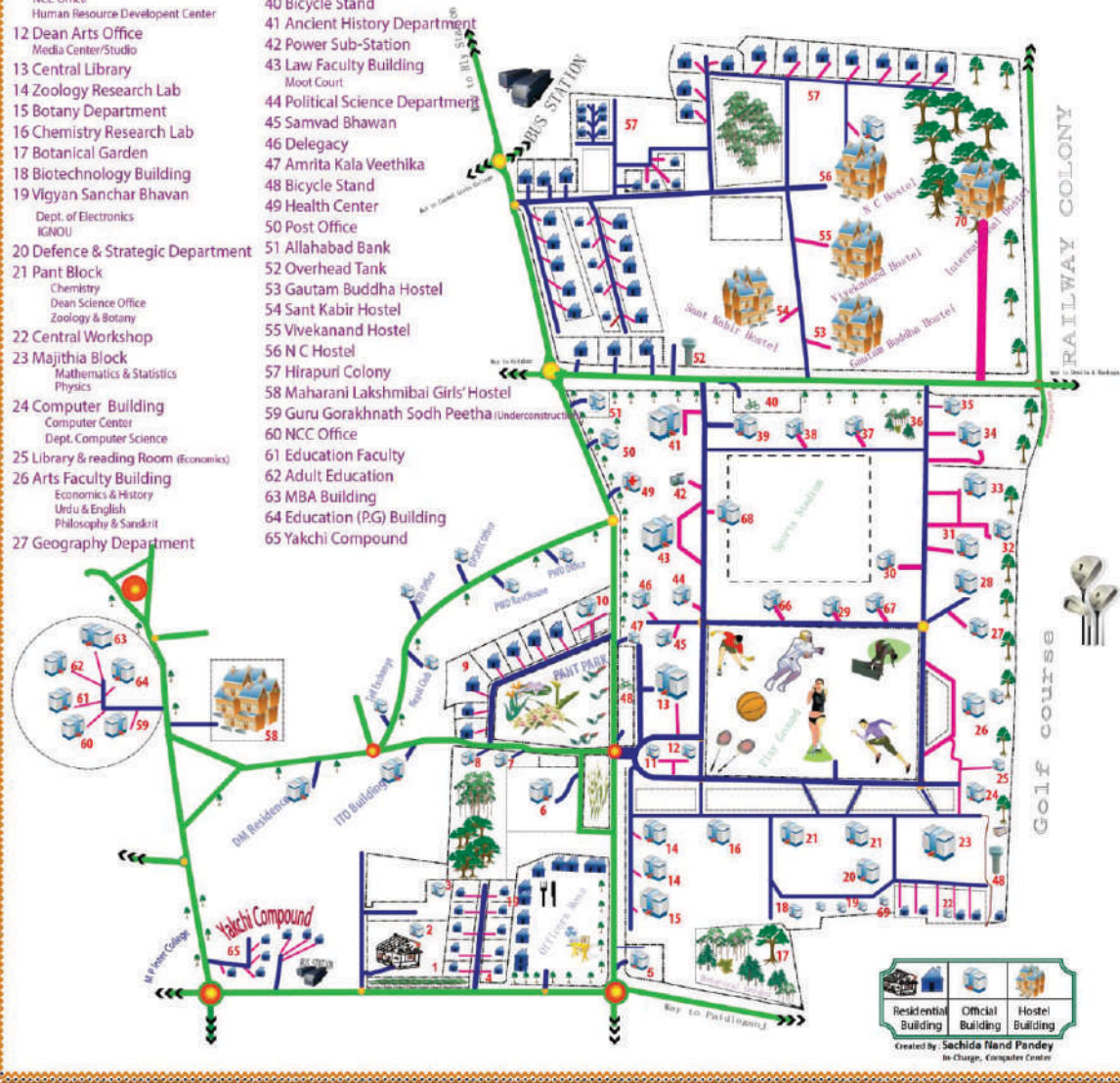
